	Great Depression	wwii	1960s	1970s	1980 – 2000
The poor	All are poor, great equalizer; no"worthy" or "unworthy" poor	Returns to class system; economy rebounds with war	Divide b/t rich and poor increases; African Americans are disenfranchised	Gulf widens; mentally ill put on streets; homelessness escalates	Poverty increases; now have "generational poverty"
Care for the poor	Gov't systems fail; individuals/ churches provide care as they are able	Fed gov't increasingly provides care	Fed. gov't carries primary responsibility	Reagan slashes social welfare budgets, creates "New Poor"	Gov't & church share uneasy alliance, but gov't still primary
Culture	Massive economic ruin; migration to West	Great prosperity after WWII	Anti-authoritari- anism, racial ten- sions, anti- Vietnam war	Watergate, Iran Hostage, gas shortages, recession, Moral Majority, family values	Family values, anti- gay issues, distrust of government
Leadership/ Legislation	FDR's New Deal puts nation back to work; Works Projects Adm., Civilian Cons. Corps	FDR's programs continue	Assassination of key leaders (JFK, MLK, RFK); LBJ institutes second wave of welfare reform with his Great Society	Reaganomics calls for decreased gov't provision for poor	Faith-based Initiative Office in DC;TANF, welfare- to-work programs
