Last year's report showed a need for attention for GSSW competencies 4, 8, and 9 in the field rubric conducted that year. These competencies were regarding research-informed practice, policy practice, and evaluation of practice. While competency 8 did increase in the field rubric, competencies 4 and 9 did not. However, this year we have worked toward transitioning to new standards from the 2022 Council on Social Work Education. As we update BSW and MSW curriculum to reflect these standards, we will also be updating our methods of measuring competence.

The previous results of the SWEAP knowledge assessment showed competency in all areas except 5: Policy, which was the case again this year. Our policy curriculum team met this year to discuss overhauls to the course, including our assessment methods to ensure we are accurately delivering and measuring student ability regarding the content. We are hopeful that the next round of knowledge assessment will show an improvement in the score for area 5.

We have also increased efforts at belonging based in the survey regarding implicit curriculum last year. Our program leadership held listening sessions, hosted gatherings, and implemented a Store/Fridge site in our building. We will assess this aspect of our curriculum next year to see what effect these efforts have had on the student experience.

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Part 5: Assessment Team and Review Process Description
Please provide a description of how this report was compiled.

Team: The assessment team for these direct measures consists of Associate Dean for Academic Affairs (ADAA), Program Manager for Academic Affairs, Academic Consultant & Instructional Designer, and the Field Education office, with input from the BSW Program Director. Faculty for 4373 provided data for competency 10 at the request of the ADAA and Academic Consultant & Instructional Designer.

Process: The Field Rubric is completed by the Field Liaisons who directly observe and assess students applying their knowledge, skills, and cognitive and affective processes in the internship setting. An overall rating of 3-competent or higher is required for students to complete the internship program, but the GSSW has set a benchmark for at least 80% of our students to reach 4-proficient or 5-excellent. The Liaisons rate the competency of the students in their sections, and the data is compiled and analyzed by the Field Education Program manager. The Social Work Education Assessment Project (SWEAP) assists the Academic Consultant in administering and analyzing data from the FCAI. The Academic Consultant & Instructional Designer collaborates with the ADAA to analyze data for each competency area, and the ADAA writes the final report.
